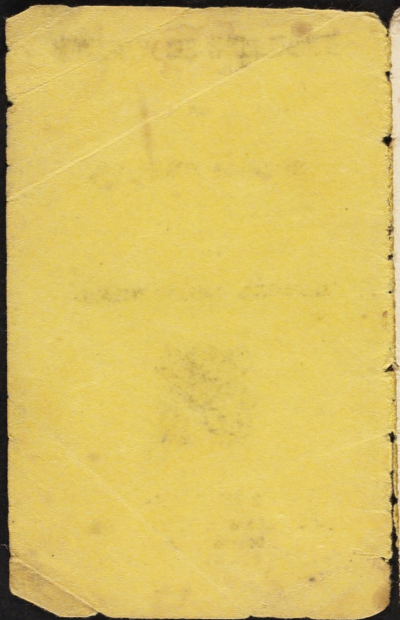

ice,

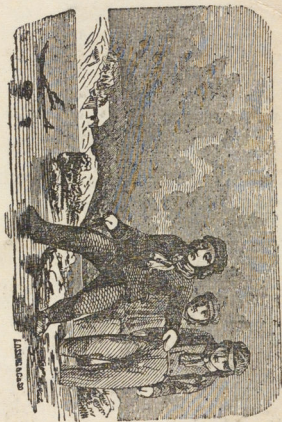
Upon a summer's day,

at home,

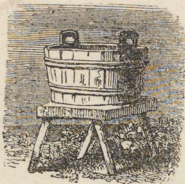
Or sliding on dry ground,

SIMPLE RHYMES.



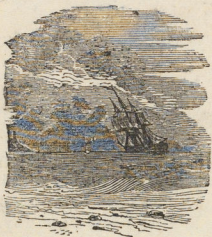
They that wash on Monday,

 Which made poor Simon

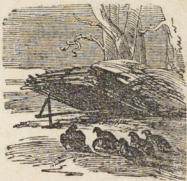


I saw a ship a-sailing,

quack !"



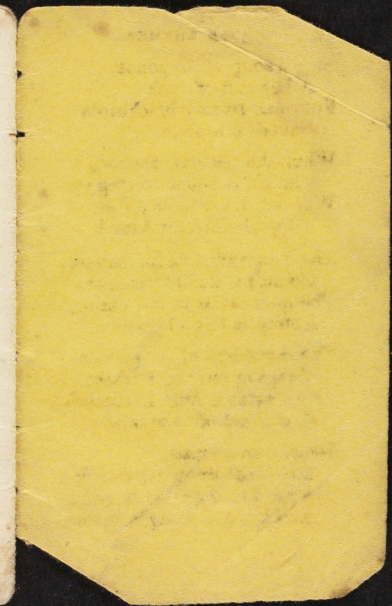
Sing a song of sixpence,
